RENT INCREASE - 4.1%

At its meeting in January the Management Committee reviewed a detailed Budget for the next four years. After considering the financial forecasts, and the issue of affordability, they agreed a Rent Increase of 4.1%, being 1% over the current headline rate of inflation of 3.1%.

The Budget was set to include the funds required to carry out Major Repairs over the four year period as recommended in our recent Stock Condition Survey. This includes such items as kitchen replacements in our original Improvement Schemes. The exact detail and timing of these Major Repairs are still under review, but the general pattern is agreed. The

approved increase is required to ensure that sufficient funding is in place for these Major Repairs and to continue to provide a high level of service to tenants.

The Co-operative's level of Reserves and available Cash is under continual review and remains adequate for future business.

The increase of 4.1% will apply to all Rents, Management Fees and Service Charges.

Tenants on Secured Tenancies will continue to have their rents set by the Rent Officer.

BARLANARK ROAD EXTENSION UPDATE

Good progress is now being made on the demolition contract for the Bressay and Barlanark Road blocks of vacant properties. Despite some early teething problems to do with the disconnection of gas and electricity supplies, the contractor is confident that the contract will be complete by mid to late February.

It is hoped that Scottish Homes will then allow the Co-operative to purchase the land before the end of March. Keep watching the Newsletter for further news!!


