CALVAY DIRECTOR GOES ON SECONDMENT



In the May edition of Calvay News we reported on a conference to launch plans agreed between the City Council and The Scottish Executive for the transfer of all the City Council's housing stock. Since then work has been proceeding to get the proposed new Glasgow Housing Association up and running and ready to work with tenants on the proposed stock transfer.

To help them prepare these plans, Glasgow Housing Association approached existing associations and co-operatives asking them to second staff for a year.

At the time of writing, agreement has been reached, in principle, for the Co-operative's Director to take up a secondment to Glasgow Housing Association. Discussions are continuing to identify the Co-operative's own staffing needs over this period, and it is likely that we will bring in part time Director services and recruit a Development Agent to carry out the Co-operative's continuing Development work.

We will provide members with an update in the next newsletter.

BARLANARK PARK REGENERATION

Following a considerable break, a meeting of the Barlanark Park Regeneration Group was held on 11 July, attended by representatives of the Co-operative, City Council Land Services, and Impact Arts. Local Councillor Jim Coleman, who has taken a close interest in this project, also attended the meeting.

The meeting heard that work on the project has been delayed because the contractor has been diverted to an urgent job at Glasgow Green. However, work should recommence soon and a completion date of mid September is now being pursued.



Impact Arts and the local volunteers have finished the mosaic to be installed at the 'meeting place' and this will be put in place in September when other work has been completed.

Arrangements are being made for an event to mark completion of the park. This should take place on the afternoon of 20 September. Further details to follow.
