Change at the Top

Last year the Co-operative held a Special General Meeting to adopt a new set of rules

One of the new rules limits the Chairperson's term of office to a maximum of 5 consecutive Annual General Meetings. On checking back our minutes we found that this means our present Chairperson, Betty Lindsay has to step down after this AGM.

There must have been few people in the Calvay area who didn't know Betty before she took up post. There must certainly be few now who are unaware of the tremendous effort she puts into her role as Chairperson.

Staff / Committee Away Day


On Thursday, 12th September, 1996 most of the staff and committee of the Co-operative will be attending a training away day.

How Does The Co-operative Work? Maintenance Section

In previous Newsletters we have outlined the work of the Co-operative's Staff and Committee in Development and Housing Management. In this edition we will cover the work of the Maintenance Section.

Our Maintenance activities are overseen by the Management and Maintenance Sub-committee, chaired by Peter Howden. The Maintenance Staff are: Chris O'Hara, Technical Manager; John Bremner, Clerk of Works and Tracy Johnstone, Maintenance Assistant.

All our Maintenance work is carried out by outside contractors under the direction of the staff team. Our budget for payments to contractors in this financial year amounts to £112,000 or nearly £300 per tenanted property. Most of this money will be used to fund day to day repairs reported to the office but £34,000 is to be used for cyclical works, such as external painterwork.

With the advice of the staff, the Sub-committee set policies to govern the Co-operative's Maintenance work. The policies cover a wide range of issues, including: the repairs we will carry out; the responsibilities of tenants; target times for completion of repairs and selection of contractors.

The Committee have recently approved a statement of our commitment to quality in carrying out Maintenance work. We will:-

Take prompt action on all repairs complaints we receive.

Keep track of your repair on our computerised system which will be closely monitored and regularly reviewed.

Keep you fully informed. Our Maintenance staff will update you on progress towards completing the necessary repairs. If we have to order materials to complete the works, you will be advised of the materials being ordered and of the timescale for delivery.

Be available during office hours to answer any questions you may have.

Respond with speed and professionalism to all queries. All Calvay Co-operative staff are trained to answer your calls promptly, efficiently and courteously.

Follow up on all repair work within two days of completion.

In many cases the follow up to repair work will be by personal visit. Sometimes this is not possible: tenants may be unable to give access or the cost of the repair may not justify it. In all cases tenants will receive a tenant satisfaction card to complete and return to the office.

If you are interested in hearing more about our Maintenance work we would encourage you to attend the regular General Meetings. If you are interested in contributing to this area of our work by serving on the Management and Maintenance Sub-committee please contact the office.

Welfare Benefits Advice - Back To Work Benefit

If you return to work after a period of unemployment, and had been in receipt of Income Support for at least 6 months prior to this, you are entitled to claim Housing Benefit for up to your first four weeks of employment, regardless of your income.

The Benefits Agency should issue you with a claim form for this when you sign off.
This extended Housing Benefit has been

available since April, 1996.

If you feel that you should have qualified for this benefit but were not advised of it, contact Patricia at the office who will help you make a back dated claim (please note that back dated payments are not guaranteed). Alternatively, you could contact the Benefits Agency or the Money Advice Centre, for assistance.

Starting to clear out shrub beds.


Now is the time to start tidying up your garden, in preparation for winter.
